




# SDS Accommodate Access


Office of Student Disability Services

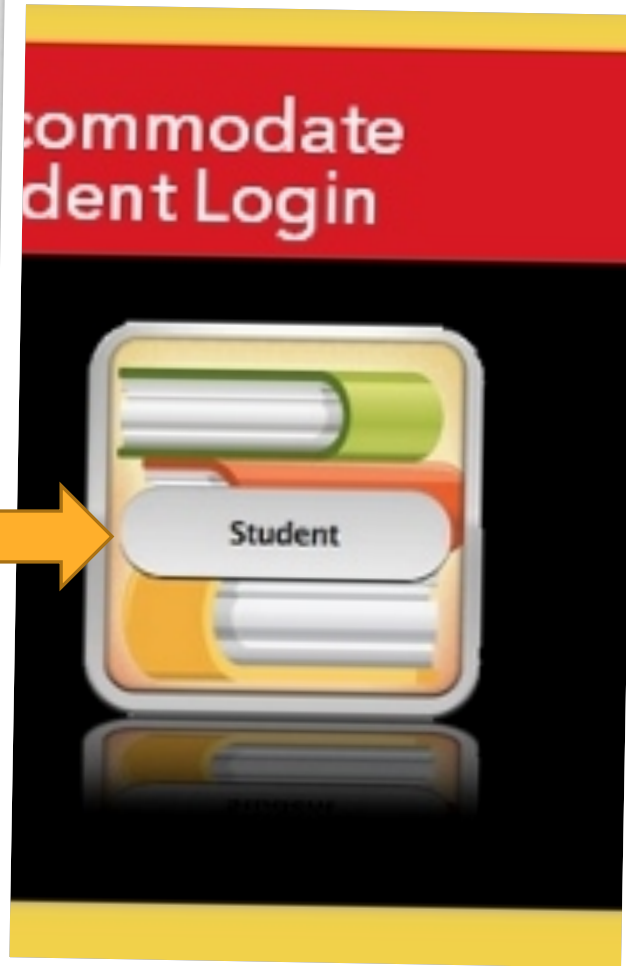






You will be directed to the Accommodate log-in page after clicking the icon
